How did Lyme disease get started in humans?

At the end of WWII, Nazi scientists were brought to the US under project Paper Clip. John Foster Dulles was the Secretary of State under President Harry Truman; he cleaned up the Nazi scientist's files so Pres. Truman would allow them to come to the US and work for our government. Among the many scientists that came to the US was an infectious disease researcher by the name of Eric Taub; Eric Taub had been experimenting with tick-borne diseases in Nazi Germany. The Nazis had even field-tested this in Russia before the end of WW2. Eric Taub's speciality was mosquito and tic vectors. He worked for the US Army's biological Warfare department and performed his research on their offshore germ warfare site located on Plum Island off of Montauk, New York.

Eric Taub basically weaponized Lyme disease which primarily was present in animals; his experiments enabled both mosquitos and tics to carry the disease. The first case appeared in Lyme Connecticut. Lyme was developed as a biological weapon to disable enemy troops while making it almost impossible to diagnose the cause.

What causes Lyme disease?

Lyme disease is caused by a bacterial spirocette, Borrelia Burgdorferi. In the United States, this is usually a bacterium

called Borrelia burgdorferi. Lyme is often accompanied by coinfections: borreliosis, anaplasmosis, babesiosis, Powassan virus, and *B. miyamotoi* infection. It spreads to humans through the bite of an infected tick or mosquitos. The ticks that spread it are deer ticks. They are usually found in the:

- Northeast
- Mid-Atlantic
- Upper Midwest
- Pacific coast, especially northern California

These ticks can attach to any part of your body. But they are often found in hard-to-see areas such as your groin, armpits, and scalp. Usually, the tick must be attached to you for more than 24 hours to spread the bacterium to you.

What are the symptoms of Lyme disease?

Early symptoms of Lyme disease start between 3 to 30 days after an infected tick bites you. The symptoms can include:

- A red rash called erythema migrans (EM). Most people with Lyme disease get this rash. It gets bigger over several days and may feel warm. It is usually not painful or itchy. As it starts to get better, parts of it may fade. Sometimes this makes the rash look like a "bull's-eye."
- Fever
- Chills

- Headache
- Fatigue
- Muscle and joint aches
- Swollen lymph nodes ("swollen glands")

If the infection is not treated, it can spread to your joints, heart, and nervous system. The symptoms may include:

- Severe headaches and neck stiffness.
- More EM rashes on other areas of your body.
- Facial palsy, which is a weakness in your facial muscles. It can cause drooping on one or both sides of your face.
- Arthritis with severe joint pain and swelling, especially in your knees and other large joints.
- Pain that comes and goes in your tendons, muscles, joints, and bones.
- Heart palpitations, which are feelings that your heart is skipping a beat, fluttering, pounding, or beating too hard or too fast.
- An <u>irregular heart beat</u> (Lyme carditis).
- Episodes of dizziness or shortness of breath.
- Inflammation of the brain and spinal cord.
- Nerve pain.
- Shooting pains, numbness, or tingling in the hands or feet.

How is Lyme disease diagnosed?

To make a diagnosis, your health care provider will consider:

- Your symptoms
- How likely it is that you were exposed to infected Deer ticks; Bull's Eye rash appeared.
- How likely it is that you could have other illnesses that cause similar symptoms
- The results of any lab tests

Most Lyme disease tests check for antibodies made by the body in response to infection. These antibodies can take several weeks to develop. If you are tested right away, it may not show that you have Lyme disease, even if you have it. So you may need to have another test later.\

Can Lyme disease be cured with natural remedies?

The simple answer is yes, however, it requires a global approach. In my clinical experience, Lyme patients have multiple heath issues that must be addressed prior to treating the Lyme or concomitantly and or its coinfections.

- 1. Need a comprehensive energetic evaluation that may include the CyberScan System, divining rods, or muscle testing.
- 2. Need to test liver, intestines, kidneys, lymphatics, thyroid, thymus, dental issues (root canal teeth, cavitations, periodontal or gum

disease, mercury fillings, galvanic reactions) cranial distortions, infected tonsils, pH, integrity of the brain, emotional issues, dietary intake, mold and fungal issues, parasites, etc.

- 3. Must test for presence of glyphosate, heavy metals, chemtrails, food additives, trapped vaccines/adjuvants, trapped medications, chemicals, radioactive materials.
- 4. Test effective remedies:
 - a. Orega Wild: 100% pure Mediterranean oregano
 - b. Ozone: effective against all pathogens and toxins
