

# **Radionics: At the Crossroads of Science and Magick**

## **What Google says about it:**

**Radionics** is an alternative medicine technique developed in the early 20th century by Dr. Albert Abrams, which claims to diagnose and treat diseases from a distance using "subtle energy" or "vibrations". It relies on specialized devices to detect and correct supposed imbalances in a patient's electromagnetic field, often using samples like blood or hair. It is considered pseudoscience, lacking scientific evidence.

## **Short History of Radionics:**

It all started in San Francisco in 1910 by Dr Albert Abrams while examining a patient and noticing a change of sound coming from the patient's abdomen while that patient faced west direction. Later the wires were added and the box containing the potentiometers and thus it became possible to diagnose by creating a rate list. Rate list was a numerical representation of different ailments, diseases or conditions. Dr Abrams called his discovery The Electronic Reactions of Abrams or E.R.A. (Taylor Swift liked the name).

## **Agricultural Applications (U.K.A.C.O.)**

UKACO was a company that started up in the late 1940's and continued into the 1950's. It was formed by three men Curtis P. Upton, William J. Knuth, and Howard Armstrong. What was unique about UKACO was they killed insects that were destroying farmer's crops, not by spraying the crops with a ton of pesticide. They killed the insects using radionics, and did so with far more success and for a lot less money than when the farmers sprayed their fields.

The three men, Upton, Knuth, and Armstrong traveled rural areas of the United States telling farmers that they could get rid of various kinds of insect pests that were eating their crops better than the farmers could do with their chemical sprays. Understandably the farmers were skeptical, but UKACO offered the farmers a contract that stated: "no control, no pay". The farmers had nothing to lose if they weren't satisfied with UKACO's results they wouldn't pay.

The farmers must have gotten really skeptical when they saw the UKACO boys in action. They would take a photograph of the farmer's field, then they would "paint" a small amount of insecticide onto the photo, they would then place the photo in a radionic instrument made by Galen T. Hieronymus then turn the instrument on and broadcast to the field in the photo.

But the amazing thing was they got results, better results than anyone got spraying their crops with insecticide. In one experiment an aerial photo was taken of a corn field and one corner of the photo was cut off. The field had a heavy infestation of Japanese Beetles. They broadcast to the field with their radionics machine as described above. After the broadcasts, 80 to 90 per cent of the beetles had died or

left the field. In the corner of the field that was cut off in the photo, the beetle infestation was still 100 per cent.

The success of UKACO didn't make the guys at the chemical companies very happy. The chemical companies got together with the USDA ( United States

Department of Agriculture) with the intention of putting UKACO out of business. They (the USDA and the chemical companies) launched a publicity campaign against UKACO to discredit them in the eyes of farmers. The campaign against UKACO by the USDA and the chemical companies was very persistent, and successful. UKACO was forced to close its doors because of the lack of customers.

This wasn't an isolated incident in the history of radionics. Many times when it was proven radionics was much more successful and much cheaper than using conventional methods such as spraying chemicals. The big boys at the chemical companies would get their pals in government to either discredit or take legal action against the radionic practitioner. UKACO called the technology that they were using: radiotonic, biotonic, homeotronics, radiurgic.

### **Ruth Drown**

Allegedly worked as Dr Abrams secretary on and off in the early twenties. Worked as a chiropractor, but some sources state that she had no formal medical or scientific training.

Was the first practitioner to use distant treatments as a regular practice.

Called her devices Homo Vibra Ray or H.V.R. and was the first practitioner able to obtain the images of internal organs of her patients.

### **George de la Warr**

British practitioner who was hired initially by owners of American radionics instruments (in Britain)to create copies as WWII made them difficult or impossible to buy in England.

Was first to use so called "complementary rate".

Created a first radionics camera.

### **Other important individuals in radionics history:**

T. Galen Hieronymus (very often radionics instruments are called hieronymus' machines)

Malcolm Rae and his geometric cards

David Tansley and the Radionic Association (British)

### **Witness, Stick, Rate**


Witness is a part of the radionics instrument where the link to the target is inserted.

To discourage usage of radionics instruments, there was a company created at some point that used name "Radionics" and in such a way copyrighted that term. Manufacturers of radionics machines used other names such as Psionics, Eloptic (from electrical and optics) to avoid law suits. Some early practitioners believed that radio waves were behind successful outcomes in medicine and agriculture and radio-engineers were hired by courts to prove that those machines could have not operated as radio devices causing some of them to even get prison sentences like Ruth Drown.
